March NEIQC Business Minutes The NorthEast lowa Quilters' Guild met on March 1, 2022, at the Luana Bank and via Zoom at 2:00 and 7:00 pm. Approximately 8 people attended via Zoom at 2:00 and 12 people attended via Zoom at 7:00. The night's program was Jarret Johnson, on "Confessions of a Newbie Quilter." He narrated a trunk show of some of his quilting adventures and discoveries over the past few years. He told us that today was his first day at his new job: Red-Roxy Quilt Co. President Ila Benzing opened the meeting with a welcome to members and guests. Last month's minutes and treasurer's report were printed in the newsletter and emailed. Mary Schroeder moved the minutes to be approved; Marty Berda seconded; minutes approved.

- Ila Benzing reported to the guild on the March beginning balance of \$5,295.29. Bert had a payment of program and checks
 to support quilting on public TV and Winterset museum for a final balance of \$4,720.49. We now have 69 members. Motion

She encourages all members to make items for the Canister Raffle. The members will get their raffle tickets at the April guild meeting and can begin selling after April 20th. If you have a

festival/event where the raffle quilt can be displayed and raffle tickets can be sold, please contact Marty and she will get it on the travel schedule.

New Business:

March NFIQC Board Meeting Minutes Board Meeting - 3-22-22 @ 7:00 Via Zoom. Board members present included President IIa Benzing, Vice President Melodye Protsman, Treas. Bert Hass, Sec. Martha Bartenhagen, Hist. Carol Maki, Prog. Mike Ellingsen, Show Ch. Marty Berda, Show Ch. Jen Hertrampf, Zoom facilitator Arlene Klatt Secretary's minutes - Bert Hass moved the minutes to be approved, Marty Berda seconded; Secretary's minutes were approved. Treasurer's report - Bert Hass emailed her March Treasurer's report with an ending balance of \$4646.99. She discussed two new members and the board recommended they pay dues at the June meeting. She has 70 members on the rolls. Mike Ellingsen moved the treasurer's report to be approved, Jen Hertrampf seconded; Treasurer's report was approved.

Old business:

- Zoom fee was discussed: Arlene will renew and be reimbursed by Bert.
- Quilt Network is April 9 in Kalona. Ila reported that we need to respond by March 27th. The guild will pay for mileage and meals. Arlene reported that our dues are paid for 2022. If no one attends in person, Mike will make copies of our guild information/brochure and mail it to Kalona to be handed out to attendees.
- Ila reported we can have a Bus trip (Friday, September 9th) to the Madison quilt show with Warco bus (55 passenger) for \$1675. We charged about \$40 dollars per person last time, which included bus ticket, quilt show ticket, drinks, and snacks. Ila will have a sign-up sheet for the bus trip at the April guild meetings. Members must pay at the time of sign-up. We will open the trip up to the public in May. Jen Hertrampf moved the bus trip to be arranged; Melodye Protsman seconded; motion passed.

New business:

The board discussed and recommended having one meeting in June for Annual meeting, voting on new officers, and paying dues. Mike will put information and details in the program email.lla will have paper ballots at the April meetings to vote on moving the annual meeting from May to June. Changes to By-laws or handbook can be voted on at any meeting by the members. Arlene made a motion, Mike seconded; motion passed.

The night's program was Lynn Vogel, a fabric representative from EE SCHENK with a trunk show and lecture. Lynn gave helpful tips on the quilts she's made and handed out. President lla Bernzing opened the meeting with a welcome to members. Last month's minutes and treasurer's report were emailed to members. Julie Rotach moved the minutes to be approved; Carolyn Vogel seconded; minutes approved.

Bert Hass reported to the guild of the March beginning balance of \$4,646.99. Bert had a payment for the Zoom license and deposit of dues paid, for a final balance of \$4,506.83. - Bus Trip Ila is the contact for the Madison Quilt Show in Wisconsin. It is \$45 to reserve your spot on the bus. This will include the bus, quilt show ticket, and snacks.  You will need to pay at the May meeting or by mail; Ila Benzing, PO Box 159, Monona, IA. 52159. Registration for non-members will begin in May.

Martha Bartenhagen, Newsletter Marge Johnson, Program Nancy Sjoka, Show Ch. Marty Berda, Show Ch. Jen Hertrampf Secretary's minutes - Bert Hass moved the minutes to be approved, Marty Berda seconded;Secretary's minutes were approved. Minutes will reflect voting and bylaws.

Treasurer's report - Bert Hass emailed her March Treasurer's report with an ending balance of \$4646.99. Jen Hertrampf moved the treasurer's report be approved, Nancy Sjoka, seconded; Treasurer's report was approved. Bert reported that she will need to get stamps soon. She also reported that she pays 58.5 cents per mile reimbursement for our program speakers, which is theFederal rate. Bert asked that a copy of the presenter's contracts be forwarded to her for her records.

Old business:

- Hay Days- the quilt show will be held at the Community Center with a theme of Quilts of Valor. The Guild's Raffle Quilt will be on display at the show and tickets available for sale. Guild members can sign up to work at the Hay Days Quilt Show at the May guild meeting. Bert has some boards and ladders, but could use a few more. Workers could also bring sheets.
- Ila reported on the Bus trip (Friday, September 9th) to the Madison quilt show. The Parking will be at Fisk Farm & Home in Decorah, Fareway (SE Corner) in Waukon, and McDonald's far parking lot in Prairie du Chien. Nancy Sojka is now the contact person for the bus trip.

New business:

By Laws- We will look into Bylaws and handbook to see who is responsible for organizing retreats and bus trips in the future.
 Vice President Melodye Protsman suggested that the vice president position could be in charge of bus trips and retreats. She also suggested that guild members could also volunteer to plan and be the contact for bus trips and retreats that interested them personally.

- In June, the Guild Board will have a meeting to discuss the bylaws. All members are invited to attend and go over the by-laws. The meeting will be held June 27th or 28th (subsequent to reserving a meeting room) at the Robey Memorial Library in Waukon at 5:00 pm. In May 2019, the position of librarian was eliminated from the board/guild but has not been taken out of the bylaws. Mike has not heard back from the Winneshiek County Fair board if the October guild meeting can be held at the quilt show site, so members can see the space in person before the show. Mike is planning for the guild's 40th anniversary program and Candace Arp's presentation to be held at the November meeting. Candace, Nancy, and Mike will plan the festivities
