Veteran's Day is fast approaching, and we are busy planning several Quilt of Valor Award Ceremonies. We are working toward ceremonies with the Lansing VFW and




I would like to thank everyone for their help in making the quilts; it's been a lot of fun. The big reward is seeing the veterans' reactions when they receive the quilts.

### 9-5-2017 Meeting, Luana Savings Bank 7:00 pm

President Lori Heitman began the meeting with a prayer and refreshments were served by Susie Blake, Cheryl Mulder, LaVonne Hartson, Madonna Stumme, and Marty Berda; ). Thanks were expressed to the hostesses. 51 members and 1 guest, Betty Foels, attended. New members attending were Mary Lou Sorum from August and Janet Teslow who joined this evening and received a member folder. Copies of the updated Bylaws and Handbook were given to the members along with a copy of the past quilt show financial report. 2017-18 membership sign-up was held prior to the meeting. Refreshments for Oct. afternoon will be served by Karen Kulper and Donna Ashbacher and in the evening by Roxanne Schnitzler and Janet Teslow. Officers present were introduced.

Marty Berda moved and Barb Davidson seconded to approve the minutes as published in the newsletter; motion carried. Christine McConnell reported treasury balance of \$8,804.89. 2016 quilt show balance was \$1131.32 as shown on the financial report distributed to the members. Lori reported that the board has prepared an estimated budget for the 2017-19 cycle of \$17,000 which will be a shortfall of funds.

The board is looking at different venues for the show to reduce costs. Several areas at the quilt show were lower in income as well as attendance being lower. The board meets Oct. 26 at 6:00 pm at Gus & Tony's in Waukon and ideas and suggestions are encouraged to be shared with board members. Members are also welcome to attend the board meeting.

Marilyn Barron reported on charity quilt work that she and Sharon Schmiedel have completed; 5 tops with batting and backing are ready for members to quilt. The guild has previously donated quilts to Camp Winnebago but new sites will be needed as the camp is closing. One site is the U of Iowa pediatrics and infant departments and another is the Iowa 4-county battered women's resource center. Both give quilts to patients/clients. Members are encouraged to also look at the charity quilt information on our guild website. Ila Benzing shared a letter from the Eastern Iowa Quilt Network about a project of making quilts for victims of hurricane Harvey. Sue Lynch also has contact info. for the Crawford County services and law enforcement related to sexually abused children. Sue Lynch reminded members that QOV sewing is open to all at Pickett Fence on Tues. Sept. 12th and at Moonlight Stitching on Wed. Sept. 13th. Pickett Fence will become a QOV store and the sewing day will move to Fri. Soon.

Ila Benzing and Jane Lamborn presented info on the 2017-18 program. Please see program info in the newsletter and on the guild website. Sept. 8 is the bus trip to Madison Quilt Expo. There are openings at retreat (Sept. 2-Oct. 1) at LouAnn's in Oelwein. Packets of info and supply lists were given to those already signed up. Reminder that Fri. is pot luck salad lunch with members bringing a salad fixing or side with lettuce and taco meat provided. Refer to retreat packet for other meal and housing info. Fri. workshop is Tall Trees Table Runner by LouAnn's quilt shop and Sat. is "Piecing, Borders and Binding Perfection" by Carol Moellers. She will also present a trunk show "Have Fun-Make Quilts-Share" at 6:30 pm Sat. that is open to all members. Challenge project info is in the newsletter. Charm packs for \$10. for the challenge were available and will be available in Oct. Door prizes were won by Lori Heitman and Christine McConnell.



A name for the show and the raffle quilt will be selected at the Nov. meeting; ideas need to be submitted to Martha prior to the Nov. meeting date (marthab@alpinecom.net) Bids for longarm quilting of the raffle quilt can be submitted to Martha also by Nov. 23 in writing; the committee has some ideas about the quilting and the bid can include longarmer's ideas if they wish; the top is 108" square; included in the bid can be backing, batt, binding if desired; please contact Martha for information on the longarm bid. A member raffle will be held for a lap size top made from the extra raffle quilt blocks, entry is by working on the raffle quilt (Martha and Marty have kept track of those sewing on the raffle quilt) and/or by selling a \$20 packet of raffle quilt tickets. Discussing and voting on judging options was held at both afternoon and evening meetings: combined vote totals—not a judged show-6, use an accredited judge-2, judged by knowledgeable quilter that is not accredited-44. Several show venues are being explored but a site has not been determined yet.


