# NEIQG May 7, 2019 annual meeting minutes

7:00 pm President Lori Heitman began with a prayer. Spring fling potluck meal was served by A-L members at 6:30. Thanks was given to the servers. 46 members attended. Lori read the list of charity projects from the past month. Deadline for the newsletter items to Marge Johnson is May 15.

April minutes were emailed to members. Marie Freerking moved to approve the minutes, Ila Benzing seconded; motion carried. Treasurer Leslie Sand reported approximately \$10,540 with several bus trip bills to be paid yet. Guild board meeting will be Tues. May 21 at 6:00 pm at the Luana Tap; all are welcome to attend.

Old Business:

Marty reported that the pre-app for the Clayton County Gaming grant was not accepted. Over 40 apps were made with 24 being accepted to continue the application process. Thanks were given to Marty and Cindy Berns for their work on the pre-app.

Discussion of having the next show be a judged show or not was held. Vote on that will be held later.

Raffle quilt info will be in the newsletter. Marty shared the pattern sample for the raffle quilt. Members are asked to bring to the June meeting a fat quarter (or equivalent) of a jewel-tone batik and officers a tone-on-tone background batik. Cutting day will be scheduled in June and a sewing day in July.

New Business:

Lori explained a request she received from the Iowa Quilt Museum for a donation from our guild. Cindy Berns moved to donate \$100., Sue Lynch seconded; motion carried.

From guild board discussion, the board proposed changing the program year to run June through May. This would correspond with election of officers and spread out expenses for members for dues, retreat, and bus trip fees. It would also relieve having many signups occur at the Sept. meeting and multiple deposits and checks for treasury records at that time. After discussion Roberta Hass moved and Sharon Schmiedel seconded to change the program year to June through May; motion carried. Financial year remains at Jan. through Dec.

The guild board recommended the office of Afternoon Chair be dropped. Program chairs are at the afternoon meeting and can make announcements and conduct votes as needed. The board feels the number of officers can



be condensed and duties shared by other officers. Nancy Sojka moved to drop the Afternoon Chair office, Sue Lynch seconded; motion carried. Corresponding changes for the bylaws and handbook will be written for membership voting.

### Quilt Show Quarterly from Marty Berda Show Co-chair

The Raffle Quilt Committee, Ila Benzing, Mary Schroeder, Sue Lynch, and Marty Berda have selected two possible patterns and decided that we want another scrappy batik raffle quilt. Both quilt patterns require strips for construction. To make it fun we want the general membership to donate jewel tone batiks and the officers to donate very light batiks (whites, ecru, etc.) The fabrics may have non-directional, small designs. We are looking for one fat quarter from each member. We will collect fabric at the June 4<sup>th</sup> and July 2<sup>nd</sup> meetings. August Sew Days will be announced at the June and July meetings.

There are still some committee chair positions available for the next show. We need Canister Raffle, Decorations, Name Tag, and Presentation (demonstrations and programs) Chairpersons. Carolyn has graciously taken Publicity Chair but would like to have help. Here is a synopsis of each of the open Quilt Show Committee chairperson's duties:

**Canister Raffle Chair** collects items from the membership for the raffle prior to the show. These items are usually quilt related: wall hangings, totes, baskets of quilt supplies, etc. You set up and take down the canister raffle display and canisters (I have the boards, canisters, and paperwork required for the show), keep records of the winners and get the items to the winners. You may begin collecting items early in 2020.

**Decorations Chair** decorates the admissions table and lunch tables. There is no budget but you may borrow items or use anything that you have available. (I usually grow pumpkins and flowers. I am happy to share for a weekend.) You can be as elaborate as you wish.

**Name Tag Chair** designs the new nametag and makes up directions which can be printed or shared via the website/newsletter. This is done shortly after the Raffle Quilt is named next fall. Once you design and publish your name tag, you're done.

**Presentations Chair** lines up mini-demonstrations, bed turnings, do-it-yourself Make-and-Take classes, etc. The presentations are usually short 20 minute blocks. It would be nice to have 2-3 of them per day. You may enlist the aid of members or use outside presenters.

Chairpersons may choose to work alone or find a friend to help. Let Marty know if you are interested in doing any of the above Chair positions for the next quilt show.

#### 5-21-19 NEIQG Board Meeting

President Lori Heitman called the board meeting to order at 6:00 pm at the Luana Tap on May 21. Minutes of the previous board meeting had been published in the newsletter. Treasurer's balance as of 5/16 is \$10,384.41 with several bills yet to be paid from the MSQ bus trip.

Marty Berda reported on the 2020 quilt show plans. Info on the raffle quilt will be in the upcoming newsletter: a pattern has been selected; members are asked to bring to the June guild meeting a fat quarter or equivalent of a jewel-tone batik and officers to bring a fat quarter of a cream, off white, or ecru batik for background; cutting and sewing days will be set up. Committee chairs are being lined up; Mary Schroeder will serve as canister raffle chair and members are encouraged to begin items for the canister raffle. Quilt show being judged or not will be discussed at the June and July guild meetings and voted on in August. Several options or activities instead of a judged show were discussed: AQS judging trainee, other fabric/textiles/quilt evaluator, local business people as selectors of ribbons in various categories. Also discussed was having judging/evaluating 1-2 months prior to the show with entry of all quilts on the Friday evening.

Pre-app grant written by Marty Berda and Cindy Berns for a new/used trailer for show stands through the Clayton County Gaming Boat was not selected this year; will try again next year, as well as, other grant options.

Updates to bylaws and handbook will be made to reflect changes voted approved at the May annual meeting. The March 15 no-refund statement on the MSQ bus trip form was confirmed.

The guild membership form with a \$5 fee for printing and mailing the newsletter if a printed copy is requested was reviewed. Roberta Hass moved, Marty Berda seconded to approve the form; carried. Membership forms will be available at the June guild meeting for dues payment at that time for the June-May program year. Dues payment by August will be requested to keep dues, bus trip, and retreat fees spread out and each paid separately.

Each board member will bring to the next board meeting a brief description of their officer duties to include with folders or materials for the newly-elected officer.

For photos of Show and Tell on the guild web site, the quilter will be asked to stand by her quilt. A photo membership list will be made to help officers acquaint themselves with members. All are encouraged to wear their nametags at meetings.

Quilt Show Timeline has been updated by Marty Berda and the board will update the Board Timeline at the next board meeting.

Program report by Ila Benzing and Roberta Hass: reviewed info from Network; looking to encourage "tweener" sewing time between afternoon and evening guild meetings; Sept. 6 is Madison quilt show bus trip; retreat are Nov. 1-3 at LouAnn's in Oelwein; Aug. 2019 will be 10am-5pm workshop with Cathy Bush with an evening presentation; Feb. QOV sewing; challenge project to be something with your name; programs through May 2020 are nearly set.

Marty Berda moved to adjourn, Melodye Protsman seconded; carried.
