Patchwork Casserole

This makes enough to take to a pot luck dinner or for company. It's comfort food and filling. Cook time: 55 Min Prep time: 20 Min Serves: 8-10

Ingredients

2 lb ground beef
2 c green bell pepper
1 c chopped onion
2 lb frozen hash-brown potatoes, thawed
2 can(s) (8 oz) tomato sauce
1 c water
1 can(s) (6 oz) tomato paste
1 tsp salt
1/2 tsp dried basil, crumbled
1/4 tsp ground black pepper
1 lb Velveeta cheese, thinly sliced (I used American slices)

Directions

1. Cook and stir beef in large skillet over medium heat until crumbled and brown, about 10 minutes; drain off fat.

2. Add green pepper and onion; sauté until soft, about 4 minutes. Stir in all remaining ingredients except cheese.

3. Spoon 1/2 of the meat mixture into 13x9x2 inch baking pan or 3 quart baking dish; top with 1/2 of the cheese. Spoon remaining meat mixture evenly on top of cheese.

4. Cover pan with aluminum foil. Bake in preheated 350 oven 45 minutes. Cut remaining cheese into decorative shapes; place on top of casserole. Let stand, loosely covered, until cheese melts, about 5 minutes.

I did NOT cut out cute shapes, but it looks nice!

NEIQG January 5, 2021, meeting

Our guild met thru ZOOM for our afternoon meeting at 2:00 p.m. ZOOM was also set up at the Luana Bank and Waukon Library for those wishing to attend. Approximately 17 members were able to join the meeting.

Megan Barrett from the Iowa Quilters' Museum in Winterset, Iowa, was our presenter. The program was entitled **Up Close at the Iowa Quilt Museum.** The Museum opened in May of 2016 and has about 4 exhibits each year. Megan showed us images of some of the quilts that were displayed for all of those exhibits. Titles of some of the exhibits include: Red and White, Stargazing, Art Quilts of the Midwest, Quilts of Valor, Bounty of Baskets, Feed Sacks, Blue Ribbon Quilts of the Iowa State Fair, Stitched Through Time, A Fons and Porter Homecoming, Man Made, Out of Control Quilts that Break the Rules, and several more. She held a question and answer time after her presentation.

The Museum holds an annual event called Madison County: Airing of the Quilts that is held the first Saturday in June. This event also includes a fund raising dinner and auction. This year it will be held on June 6, 2021. Megan extended an invitation to all of us to attend.

Our evening meeting also met through ZOOM at 7:00 p.m. Locations included the Luana Bank and Waukon Library. Approximately 14 members were able to join the meeting. Megan Barrett presented information and images about the current exhibit at the Museum: **String Theory: String-pieced Quilts from Past to Present.** This exhibit included quilts by 9 collectors and artists. After viewing those quilts there is no question in my mind that there are not any scraps that can't be put into a quilt ⁽²⁾ Megan held a question and answer time again.

After the presentations in the afternoon and evening we had an update from our program co-chairs regarding our upcoming months. February 6th is National Quilts of Valor sewing day. Members can join the New Albin sewing group at the Townhouse or the guild has reserved the Luana Bank also for sewing. (You will find more exact information in the newsletter.) Several members shared their projects for Show 'n Tell. No business meeting was held.
