

NEIQG Business Minutes June 7, 2022

The NorthEast Iowa Quilters' Guild met on June 7, 2022, at the Founder's Park Shelter in Elkader and via Zoom at 6:30 pm. Approximately 18 people attended in person and 7 via Zoom. Vice President Melodye Protsman opened the meeting with a welcome to members, new members, and guests. Due to impending severe weather, we introduced ourselves and presented Show and Tell projects first. Secretary Martha Bartenhagen read aloud May's minutes; Sue Lynch made a motion to approve the minutes; Marty Berda seconded; motion approved. Treasurer Bert Hass presented the June meeting treasurer's report. Bert reported to the guild the May beginning balance of \$4,414.50. Bert had a payment for the May guild program and deposits of workshop fees for Robert Kent's English Paper Piecing and interest, for a final balance of \$4,077.47. Marge Johnson moved the report to be approved; Karen Kulper seconded; report approved.

- Bert announced that our guild insurance is due in August and the Show insurance will be added at that
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- time, so we only have to pay once.Karen Kulper and Marie Freerking will be auditing the Treasurer's books soon.
- Sara Friedl-Putnum, a reporter from Seed Savers took pictures of the guild's Seed Savers Challenge projects and their creators.

Old Business:

- The Guild's Show Razzle-Dazzle will be held in Decorah on October 15th and 16th. Marty Berda announced she has another vendor registered related to woodworking projects. Sheencourages all members to make items for the Canister Raffle and gather books and magazines and sell raffle tickets. Marty handed out bookmarks to distribute far and wide and will have posters soon.

New Business:

NEIQG Business Minutes May 3, 2022

The NorthEast Iowa Quilters' Guild met on May 3, 2022, at the Luana Bank and via Zoom at 2:00 and 7:00 pm. Approximately 31 people attended in the afternoon and 11 people attended at night at the bank. Approximately 4 attended via Zoom at 2:00 and 3 people attended via Zoom at 7:00. The night's program was Robert Kent from Algona with a trunk show and lecture about English Paper Piecing. He gave helpful tips on different ways to do EPP and the different shapes to use. He showed some quilts he's made and handed

around partial samples for closer inspection of how to get the forms released. Robert held a short workshop at 3:30 pm for individual instruction on English Paper Piecing with several kits of pre cut papers and fabrics for making a single flower of a grandmother's flower garden.

- President IIa Benzing opened the meeting with a welcome to members, new members, and guests. Last month's minutes and treasurer's report were emailed and printed in the newsletter for members. With one correction, the minutes were moved to be approved by Julie Rotach; Pat Butikofer seconded; minutes approved.
- Bert Hass reported to the guild of the April beginning balance of \$4,506.83. Bert had a payment for pictures and the April guild program and deposits of vendor fees and dues paid, for a final balance of \$4,414.50. Lori Heitman moved the report to be approved; Marty Berda seconded; report approved.
- Bert Hass announced that she and Julie Rotach are the nomination committee for filling the Program Chair position. The persons in the guild positions of Vice President and Secretary are willing to continue. If you are interested in any of the board positions of Vice President, Secretary, or Program Chair position, please contact Bert Hass or Julie Rotach. At the June guild meeting, names will be taken from the floor, if anyone is interested in filling those positions and then an election will follow. Guild memberships will also be renewed at the June meeting.

Old Business: The Guild's Show is called Razzle-Dazzle and will be held in Decorah on October 15th and 16th.

Marty Berda announced that if we have an overly large number of quilts to show at the Quilt Show, you may want to prioritize which of your quilts you want to show. Marty also said we may fold some quilts to show a large number for display at the show. She has Name Tag kits, but the instructions are also on the Guild web page. If you have the 2020 one completed, it is okay to cross out the 2020 number on your name tag and put 2022 over it. She and Jen will award various prizes for name tags at the June meeting. She encourages all members to continue to make items for the Canister Raffle, and gather your magazines and books to sell at the quilt show. Marty has a travel display schedule for the raffle quilt. If you have an event that is coming up and you would like to display the quilt there, please contact Marty immediately to get on the schedule. Marty confirmed that Red Roxy Quilt Company paid for the venue at the county fairgrounds in Decorah. Ila Benzing has quilt turning categories in the newsletter. If you have any quilts you would like to have included in the quilt turning events, please consider which category you would use.

Bert Hass announced that there will be a Quilt display at Hay Days on June 11th. We will need some help on Friday the 10th. The Hay Days show will be on the 11th, and then taken down in the late afternoon. It is a Quilts of Valor display. We are inviting all that have gotten one to bring and display. Or if you have a Quilt of Valor quilt that will be given, that would be good, too. This time the display/show will be at the Monona Community Center.

Bus Trip – IIa Benzing is the contact for the Wisconsin Madison Quit Show. It is \$45 to reserve your spot on the bus. This will include bus, quilt show ticket, and snacks. Pick up spots will be in Decorah (6:00 am), Waukon (6:30 am), and Prairie du Chein(7:00 am). You should also register for your seat/contact information on the Google Form: <u>https://forms.gle/K4H4SVFzQSrFMvp88</u> You will need to pay at the May meeting or by mail: IIa Benzing, PO Box 159, Monona, IA 52159. Registration for non-members will begin in May. We have approximately 20 people signed up at present. IIa stated that 45 paid spots will cover the cost of the bus.

New Business:

The next guild meeting will be held at 6:30 pm at Founders' Park in Elkader (near St. Joseph's Catholic Church). Ila advised members about the detour into Elkader due to the bridge construction.
