America, Why I Love Her Quilt Challenge

The theme for this coming year is America, Why I Love Her. It is based on the John Wayne song "America, Why I Love Her," to help celebrate America's Quarter Millennial, semiquincentennial, bisequicentennial (250 years).

Rules are pretty simple:

- 1.Quilt must have a perimeter/circumference of 250" or less.
- 2.Quilt must have a star or circle the size of a quarter on the front side (minimum size, it may be bigger but not smaller).
- 3. Project needs to have batting & backing
- 4.It must have red or blue on the front.
- 5. You can use any type of fabric or technique, not limited to pieced, applique, embroidered (hand or machine), thread-painted, etc.

Finished quilts will be unveiled at the May 2026 annual meeting.

From the Quilt Show Co-Leads...

We are celebrating! After 2 sewing sessions, great progress has resulted in 2/3 of the quilt's blocks being constructed. We had an opportunity to see some of them up on a design wall at our last session. Those that came to help can share that blocks with more complexity were tackled and were whipped into submission through teamwork!

Thanks go out to the volunteers who have come to help! Our next session is October 18th at the Luana Bank. The Quilt Committee will arrive at 9:30 as usual to get things set up and

guild members can come anytime after 10:15-10:30. Once again, there will be a variety of jobs including labeling the blocks from the design wall by row and within row placement, working on the Criss Cross blocks, assembling the internal and external borders, and sewing and ironing as items are ready to go.
