America, Why I Love Her Quilt Challenge

The theme for this coming year is America, Why I Love Her. It is based on the John Wayne song "America, Why I Love Her," to help celebrate America's Quarter Millennial, semiquincentennial, bisequicentennial (250 years).

Rules are pretty simple:

1. Quilt must have a perimeter/circumference of 250" or less.

2. Quilt must have a star or circle the size of a quarter on

the front side (minimum size, it may be bigger but not smaller).

3. Project needs to have batting & backing

4. It must have red or blue on the front.

5. You can use any type of fabric or technique, not limited to pieced, applique, embroidered (hand or machine), thread-painted, etc.

Finished quilts will be unveiled at the May 2026 annual meeting.

Quilt Show Report

Program Chair, Carolyn Clark introduced the program presented by Megan Bracy, owner/quilter of "Dancing Elephant Quilts" – How to prepare your quilt for the Long Arm or domestic machine. Megan had many tips, showed her quilts, and recommended materials and tools that she uses. President Lynette Rose opened the meeting with a welcome to all members, new members, and guests.

Secretary's Report: The November guild minutes were emailed to members and will be printed in the newsletter. Arlene Klatt moved the November minutes be approved; Carolyn Clark seconded; minutes approved.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Melodye Protsman reported to the guild of the November beginning balance as \$11,808.87. Melodye reported expenses of the November guild program, EWALU retreat fees, and storage fee for trailer; income of membership dues, retreat fees, bus trip deposits, and workshop fees for an ending balance of \$11,783.48.
